ROUND 3 FOOTBALL PREVIEW

Many great fixtures are pencilled in across the WGfNC this Saturday but a grand final rematch definitely deserves top billing.

Round three sees reigning champions Tooradin-Dalmore host Phillip Island in a game that is sure to have serious ramifications at the pointy end of the ladder.

If the Seagulls salute on their home deck, they move three games clear of the Bulldogs – who have played one less game.

The Seagulls are looking good, and it's almost impossible to see the Bulldogs finishing in front of Tooradin if the Seagulls prevail this week.

On the flip side, the Doggies could be level with the Gulls after the first month of footy if they get the choccies, with Tooradin sitting out next week after using their round-four clash against Cora Lynn as the season opener.

Sorry to use cliches...but this is a genuine eight-point contest...a real fork-in-the-road moment – particularly for Phillip Island.

The Bulldogs were held to just one goal in the first half against Inverloch-Kongwak last week, and with Tooradin's backline boasting the likes of Cooper Shipp, Ray Lengyel, Brad Lenders, Adam Oxley, Jehi Esler, Adam Galea and skipper Jordy Kelly, it's hard to see the visitors kicking a winning score.

Cam Pedersen looms as an obvious danger, but it's the Seagulls by 14 points.

The other intriguing matchup in the WGfNC sees Nar Nar Goon host an improving Garfield at Spencer Street.

The Goon thumped the Stars last season, but the young Garfield side is improving and will put up a much-better fight.

"We're really looking forward to it, it's a massive challenge for us to see where we're at, because we rate Nar Nar Goon really highly...they should be top-three this year and gave us a hiding both times last year," Garfield coach Paul Carbis said.

"We've got to concentrate on playing our way and see where that takes us.

"We're rivals, we've got respect for them, and so it should be a great day."

The Stars are improving, and the Goon will be without spearhead Dermott Yawney – who fractured his finger last week – but Justin Stanton's men will still be too good.

Yawney's absence after half time seemed to free up options for the Goon, who were becoming too Yawney-centric.

The Stars have improved, but are coming from a long way back...it's the Goon by two goals per quarter.

Shaun Sparks and his Cora Lynn outfit can expect a fierce opening from Kooweerup, who head to the Cobradome after a poor display against Nar Nar Goon last week.

The Demons won a wet-weather slog against Dalyston in round one, but were shown up on a dry deck after half-time by a smooth-moving Goon unit.

Demons coach Rhys Nisbet will be all about the contest this week, in order to stem the flow to Nathan Gardiner, Ryan Gillis and co, so expect a much-improved effort from his side.

The Cobras have stiffened up their backline, with Luke Black and Matt Briggs sure to get big jobs on dangerous Demons in Jason Wells and Adam Amin.

Combined, the Cobras and Demons have had wins over Dalyston, Garfield and Korumburra-Bena...so question marks still loom over the quality of both teams heading in.

This one just has the feel of a close one – it's the Cobras by single figures.

Either Dalyston or Korumburra-Bena have the opportunity to sneak into the top-six when the two teams collide at Dalyston on Saturday.

With one win each, the Magpies and Giants are on equal points with teams four to seven on the ladder, and with Kooweerup (6th) and Phillip Island (7th) both going in as underdogs this week, the winner could well hold down a position in the top half.

The Magpies were tough last week, shaking off Kilcunda-Bass with a brilliant last quarter, with class acts such as Mitch Hallahan, Brayden Duve, Blake Carew and Curtis Muffett lifting their team across the line.

Paul Fermanis is doing a brilliant job with his young Giants... but this looks a bridge too far.

It's the Magpies to make it back-to-back victories for the first time since round 14, 2017, with a 23-point victory.

In other games this week, Warragul Industrials should open its 2023 account with a visit to Bunyip, while undefeated Inverloch-Kongwak welcomes a winless Kilcunda-Bass to the Inverloch Rec Reserve.

Despite having no wins on the board, the Panthers were competitive in the second half against Tooradin and were only over-run late by Dalyston last week.

The Panthers will be competitive, but the Sea Eagles look extremely sharp this season and will cruise home with the four points.

ROUND 2 NETBALL REVIEW

Garfield's impressive beginning to the WGFA A Grade season continues to gain momentum after the Stars rode a fast start to a 49–43 victory over Bunyip on Saturday.

The Stars, who won six games last season, have now won their opening two contests to sit in fifth place on the ladder.

After a 34–31 victory over Cora Lynn, the Stars began brilliantly against the Bulldogs; last year's runners up that have lost multiple players from their starting line up.

With Tyla Redwood (GS) in red-hot form in goals, and Chloe Bluhm (WA), Kaisha Stacey (C) and Macy Newcombe (WD) playing with flair through the midcourt, the Stars looked impressive building a 14–8 lead at the first break.

Bunyip cut the margin to four at half time, before the Stars regained control with a 14–11 third term.

The Bulldogs refused to lie down, but the Stars held on to keep their undefeated start alive.

Proud coach Donna Marsh said her girls deserve the spoils of victory.

"I'm exceptionally proud; I think they've shown how much they've developed over the last couple of years; just the growth in them as individuals as well as teammates," Marsh said.

"I'm just happy for them because they've worked so hard to achieve that 2–0 result.

"There's still a long way to go in the season, and we're about to meet two of the four toughest teams over the next fortnight (Nar Nar Goon and Korumburra-Bena), but it's been a solid start."

The Stars had three players move up from B Grade and play some serious court-time on the weekend.

Ash Snell (GD/GK) played all four quarters in defence, while Stacey certainly had an impact in the first half.

Nat Loogman (GS) was the other who moved up a grade and performed admirably for a half.

"We only had five A Grade players available and it's just further proof that the club's going from strength to strength, having B Grade players playing for an A Grade spot...that's what you need," Marsh explained.

"We haven't had that development aspect before, but now we do, and that's testament to the people behind the scenes, like the committee and coaches that have come on board."

Marsh agreed that her team appears to have some real grit this year, coming out victorious in two close games.

"Last week in particular, against Cora Lynn, was definitely a big mental step for the girls," Marsh said.

"Being past players of Cora Lynn and playing against friends, when you're young in that situation you become very nervous, and you just want to walk away with the win.

"Cora Lynn had been in the same boat, so it was a really good win for us that one."

As for Bunyip, well Marsh feels for a club that had a mass exodus this season.

"I really feel for Bunyip because last year they were looking so solid, as a whole group," she said.

"Through experience I know it's tough to remain positive in that situation.

"I'm glad we won the game, and proud of the two-zip start, but I really hope Bunyip can bounce back and remain a good strong club."

A home game against Nar Nar Goon now looms large on the horizon.

"As long as our girls go in with the mindset to stick to the game structure, the scoreboard will take care of itself," Marsh said.

"I hope the game is at the standard we expect from Nar Nar Goon, and at the standard I now expect from my girls."

Marsh won't be at Beswick Street on Saturday and will be replaced for the day by Casey Demons Division One Head Coach Travis Pretty.

In the close one of round two, Nar Nar Goon is breathing a heavy sigh of relief after surviving a 43–41 thriller against Kooweerup.

The Goon trailed by one at quarter time, but a 14–9 second quarter put the visitors back on track.

Steph Lee (GA) was on fire in the second term, scoring a game-high nine goals for the quarter, while the combo of Zoe Parker (GK) and Hannah Carney (GD) really nailed down in defence.

The Goon maintained its four-goal advantage at the final break, before holding off a late Demons charge.

Ash Murphy (GA), Jayda McConkey (GS), Kate Sidebottom (C) and Talia Charalambides (GD) put in solid four-quarter efforts for the Demons.

Dalyston has continued its winning ways with a 41–23 victory over Kilcunda-Bass.

The Magpies were frugal in the second quarter, conceding just three goals, while hitting the net 11 times of their own.

Gemma Thomas (GS) was outstanding for the Magpies, scoring 30 of their 41 goals, while Alana McRae (GD) and Chloe and Olivia Bramley were ruthless in defence.

In other games this week, Korumburra-Bena had an eight goal victory over Cora Lynn, 41–33, while Inverloch-Kongwak was dominant in a 67–28 triumph over Phillip Island.

No Kelly Boyd proved no obstacle for the reigning champs, with goalers Amy Scott (GS) and Ella Sadler (GA) taking up the slack. Scott scored 37 and Sadler 30 in a well-balanced combination in the ring.

Kelsey Buxton (C) was at her explosive best for the Eagles, while Lexi Walton (C) and Amelie Wragg (WD) never gave up for the Bulldogs.

And finally, Tooradin-Dalmore almost cracked it for triple figures against Warragul Industrials, winning 95–18 on Sunday.
