

Tunstall Cricket Club Premiers B Grade 1928-29



We are unable to identify players other than Fred Thatcher (Senior) who is sitting on the right with the bat and Clarrie Bird who is standing third from the right. Other players who played in this premiership team were: Goofa Smith, Bill Davis, W. Phillips, R. McRobert, Bill Vail, J. Pepperell, G. Sullivan, W. Kennett, D. McRobert, G. Bell, B. Lathlaen

90 years ago

Tunstall CC, formed in 1927-28

- In 1888 a railway station called Tunstall was opened between Mitcham and Blackburn.
- Named after an English town which had clay of similar colour and texture.
- No-alcohol in Box Hill area as West End distanced themselves from rural East End
- New shire (rural not suburban) established in 1925
- 1933 census, Tunstall population was 728
- Box Hill shire was called Nunawading
- In 1944, Council elections were won by the party favouring severance between Mitcham and Blackburn
- New shire of Nunawading proclaimed and Tunstall renamed to give it relevance
- Major post war settlement, red brick homes replacing paddocks and orchards
- Competitive sports included Eastern Districts Egg laying competition
- Dominant cricketers were Fred Thatcher junior (in Team of the Century) and Bill Davis (incl 114 no & 4/44 vs. Box Hill South in R11 1934-35)
 - Fred junior described by Ted Aumann as the best cricketer he had seen other than Don Bradman
 - Made first Tunstall CC century v Eastern Dairies on Nov 4, 1934
 - Also played the Squeezebox
 - Opened the batting for Tunstall and BHRDCA, won BHRDCA A Grade batting in 1936. Also kept wickets
 - Moved to East Burwood for money, enticed by Jim Tainton
 - Played at Melbourne CC with Bill Ponsford

Tunstall early years

- First meeting called by Fred Thatcher
 - Moved to Tunstall from Bacchus Marsh
 - Had earlier played cricket with Bill Woodfull
 - His wife worked on the railway gates and Fred on the line
- Clarrie Bird, who ran the bus service from East Burwood to Tunstall station, donated £25 to help start the Club
- 2 teams fielded from 27-28 till 31-32
- C Grade premiers in 28-29
 - Fred Hayes scores 36 no and 31 and takes 6/39 and 6/45 in Grand Final vs. Balwyn

Tunstall early years

- 36-37- Ted Aumann made Life Member
 - Nuna played in Ringwood Association
 - Club President from 47-48 till 56-57

80 years ago

1937-38 Highlights

- Fred Thatcher senior played last game aged 55
 - Club founder
 - Made 50 in last game
- Tunstall played in Ringwood Association

70 years ago

1947-48 Highlights

- Tunstall CC changes name to Nunawading CC
- Nunawading played in all four C grade grand finals from 1946-47 to 1949-50, winning three flags.
- Nuna fields 2 senior teams (runners up in B to East Doncaster and C Grade to Surrey Hills YCW)
- B grade lost Grand Final to East Doncaster
- C Grade lost Grand Final to Surrey Hills YCW
- Saturday morning cricket introduced as working hours reduced from 44 to 40 (5 day week)
 - Nuna fields first Under 16 team
- Nuna dismissed East Doncaster for 11 in R1 C Grade 47-48
- Ted Aumann was President (served for next 10 years)
- A donation of £ 25 from Bill Milligan, who owned the Hay and Corn Feed Store on the corner of Springvale and Whitehorse Roads (next to the current fire station) that that kept the Club from going broke.
- Captains were not allowed to be selectors
- J Mclauchlan scored 106 no vs. East Doncaster in C Grade in R10

1957-58 highlights

- Nunawading wins first A grade premiership by 2 wickets outright v Blackburn.
 - Captained by Alex Culvenor, the team consisted of Culvenor , vice captain Bob Saker, George Dolan, Doug Bosworth, Eric Thornton, Ken Rout, D. Stephens, Les Jones, Bert Murphy, Tommy Reeves and Eddie Ham.
 - George Dolan scores 104 in Grand Final
- C Grade wins Premiership
- Fred Thatcher Senior awarded Life Membership
- Tom Reeves President
 - First player to take 100 wickets for Nuna
 - 27 wickets in 2 games
 - First Nuna Life Member of BHRDCA
- Eric Thornton Secretary
- Eric Best made Life Member
- Ian Davies take match figures of 13/73 vs. St Peters in R2
- Ian Macleod takes 9-33 (club record) vs. Doncaster Footballers in B12 Round 5
- Les Jones takes 8-45 in B Grade R3 vs. Mitcham
- Committee meetings run at Reserve Hotel Mitcham until new Silver Grove pavilion opened
- Forest Hill CC formed in 1955 by Nuna CC players who lived too far away
 - Jim Aumann (son of Ted) and Jim McLelland bought land in Forest Hill
 - Used old Nuna pavilion
 - Convinced council to make an oval from bush paddock
 - Nuna lost several players but donated £ 10, 10/ to help get the new club started
- Nuna fields U16 team
- Arthur Walker and Eric Best were awarded Life Membership in August 1957

50 years ago

1967-68

1967-68 season highlights

- All 4 teams played Finals, 3 in Grand Final
- C1 (beating Bulleen, 262 vs. 213) and C2 (beating Donvale outright 284 vs. 123 & 128) teams won the Premiership
 - Ken Rout scored 148 no out of 9/399 v BI North in C2 and 102 no vs. Blackburn in R1 (447 @ 90 for season)
 - C1 Captain Graeme Best made 533 runs @ 33 including 107 vs. St Peters in R3 and 102 vs. Bulleen in R4
 - Ian Macleod made 137 n.o. in R4 A grade
 - Ian Macleod took 9/33 (and made 35) in B grade R5 vs. Doncaster Footballers
 - A Grade undefeated but lost Grand Final
 - Danny Pomeroy made 206 in semi (496 for season)
 - Jack Kirby made 535 runs @ 46
 - Ian Rowe 46 wickets @ 9.3
 - Eric Thornton 42 wickets @15.8
 - Ian Davies 46 wickets @16 (wins 1st XI bowling 9 times in 13 seasons)
 - Craig 'CMAC' McDonald's father Grant played in the 1s
 - Bob Jenkin (father of Peter) made 80 and took 5/14 in B1 R9 vs. Blackburn North
- Graeme "H" Harris made 197 v Don C of C in Semi
- Jack Kirby was Captain Coach
 - Left at the end of the season as the role was advertised even though he was available
- Tom Reeves was President
 - Nuna Pres for 5 years, BHRDCA Pres for 10 years
- Paid coach ineligible for TA Reeves Trophy
 - Won by Danny Pomeroy this season
- Players promoted or dropped were notified by post
- Doug Bosworth appointed Life Member, 6th season as Club Secretary

1977-78

1977-78 Highlights

- D Grade Premiers
 - 76-77 Under 16s under Alan Haag's captaincy with stalwarts Merv Legg, John Fisher and Mick Viljoen
 - Peter Jenkin, Peter Donaldson, Jeff Woolley, John Macaulay and David Cowell
 - Ian Presnell bowled a 16 ball over and took 3 wickets (first over of R2)
 - Alan scored 174 no in GF to secure the win
 - 964 runs for the season (3 tons) at 74.14 to win club and BHRDCA batting average
 - Jeff Woolley out handled ball in Semi Final
 - Frank Kitt played guitar on zippy board at end of season celebrations

1977-78 Highlights contd

- Trevor Hutchins Club Coach
 - Coached from 74-75 and appointed John O’Sullivan as PT Instructor to lift the level of player fitness
 - Made a 228 n.o. and a 102. 682 runs for the season at an average of 62
- Ian Rowe moved down to Shield 2nds and won club and BHRDCA bowling averages
- Mal West played Under 12s
- Graeme Best made Life Member
 - His father Eric was made a Life Member in 1957
- Ray McIntosh retired as BHRDCA President in March 1977, Top Grade Shield named after him
- Mick McLachlan’ took 9/96 in B2
- Andrew McFarland took 8/44 in Shield 1.
- Birth of Nunawading City Cricket and Soccer Club:
 - Study group formed with soccer club for new social rooms
 - 250 debenture holders to purchase \$300 debentures paid to \$30 each to fund the deposit and guarantee a loan.
 - Doug Bosworth and Kevin Steele and Terry Harris were the driving forces behind this initiative
 - A Co-operative Society was formed at a special meeting on May 10, 1978
 - 178 members across both clubs were conscripted to support a bank loan of \$40,000
 - Rooms opened on March 31, 1979
- George Cross made Life Member
 - Never played for Nuna but was ‘man behind the scenes’. Ensured drinks were always ready at designated players house each week, was Club Auditor. He and wife Muriel helped the club enormously over many years

- A3 Premiership
- Ted Aumann's wife, Dorothea, passed away
- Joe Carter passed away
 - Life Membership awarded in 53-54 but not ever formerly recorded
 - He first played at Nuna in 47-48 as a 47 y.o.
 - Played county cricket with Nottinghamshire before the war
- Fred Watson names Trevor Hutchins in BHRDCA best ever 11
- Bob Saker retires to Narooma
- Trevor Saker left for Benalla




