In commencing this report, I must congratulate and thank Cricket Victoria and the many volunteers at all our clubs in the way they managed the season.

We could not have navigated our way through all the various Covid 19 protocols without the guidance provided by Cricket Victoria, along with support received from Local Government and the actions of many club volunteers who all stepped up to make sure each Saturday all our participants could play cricket in a safe environment.

The VSDCA Board, in managing the season, worked closely with the clubs and to fully complete our Pennant, T20 Twilight and JG Craig Competitions and in condensed season, was an outstanding achievement.

Congratulations to the clubs which won premierships. There was some outstanding, high quality cricket played throughout the Finals, and to win a premiership this season, players had to be at the top of their game.

A good example of this was the North/West Group 1st XI Final between Kew & Werribee which was an outstanding game of cricket played between two highly talented sides in front of a large crowd at Victoria Park, Kew. For a game to be decided on the last ball in the 80th and final over, was an incredible finish. Werribee thoroughly deserved their victory.

In the South/East Group, Caulfield lost their Qualifying Final, but regrouped quickly and bounced back strongly to record convincing wins in both their Semi and Group Finals. Caulfield is a very proud club and their players displayed a great fighting spirit after their Qualifying Final loss to win the premiership.

Legend/Hall of Fame

E A Goss (Camberwell & Hawthorn)

At the Hatch Presentation Dinner VSDCA Patron, Mr. Ken Jacobs OAM advised that Mr. E A (Dick) Goss (Hawthorn & Camberwell) was to be elevated to a 'Legend' of the VSDCA.

Mr. Goss's contribution to the Association spanned some 45 years (1910 – 1955) as both a player and administrator.

- Played 144 games, taking 592 wickets.
- In season 1909-10, he captured 101 wickets @ 7.86.
- Represented VSDCA twice.
- Captained Camberwell to premierships in seasons 1920-21 & 1921-22.
- In season 1909-1910 whilst playing for Hawthorn, in the game he captured 9/26 in the first innings and 5/31 in the second innings.
- Hawthorn Club Delegate from 1910 – 1920 and then for Camberwell from 1921 – 1955.
- Elected to the Sub-District Executive in 1916 and served until 1953 and VSDCA delegate to the VCA (1931 – 1953).

Dick Goss was Senior Vice-President of the Sub-District for nine years, until his death at Camberwell on 1 September, 1955, at the age of 79 years. In later years, trophies bearing his name were awarded at both Sub-District and club level as a mark of respect.

Mr. Jacobs also advised that he had great pleasure in announcing that Jack Sheehan (Caulfield) is to be inducted into the VSDCA Hall of Fame. This announcement was greeted with standing accumulation from all the attendees.

Mr. Sheehan has been involved with the VSDCA for 51 years, both as a player and administrator.

He joined Caulfield in 1970 and played a total of 238 games scoring 1,457 runs @ 11.75 and taking 629 wickets @ 14.78. His 1st XI career spanned some 204 games 1970-71 to 1987-88, the third highest 1st XI games for Caulfield, taking 557 wkts @ 14.78.

Jack represented the VSDCA on two occasions, played in multiple premierships sides at Caulfield, and was awarded Life Membership in 1983 and inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in 2008 and immediately elevated as a 'Club Legend'.

He was Club President for 8 seasons and served on the Caulfield Committee for 23 seasons.

Jack served as VSDCA Club Delegate for 20 seasons, and joined the Executive in 1994, Association Vice President for 8 seasons; Executive Chairman for one season before being elected as VSDCA President in 2009, a position he held until 2017. He served as VSDCA Delegate to CV (17 seasons) 2000/01-2016/17 and VSDCA Delegate to VCCL (7 seasons 2011/12 to 2017/18). In 2017 he was elected Co-Patron of the VSDCA.

Jack led the Association through a very turbulent period, where CV proposed a major restructure of turf cricket across Melbourne, which if adopted, would have seen the demise of the VSDCA and several other turf cricket associations. His leadership, passion and determination to ensure the VSDCA survived, resulted in CV deciding to abandon its plans to restructure turf cricket, thus guaranteeing the survival of the VSDCA.

Obituaries

John Farmer (Balwyn)

John made a significant contribution to Balwyn Cricket Club spanning some 35 years serving as Club President, 1st XI Scorer, Coach of JG Craig side and filled many other roles around the club when required to do so.

He joined the club when his son commenced playing cricket at Balwyn, and immediately identified the need for development of under-aged sides at the club, something that he was very passionate about.

John was a very proud Balwyn and Subby member and provided guidance to numerous people at the club and was a friend to all. In recognition of his service to Balwyn and the VSDCA he was awarded Life Membership of both organisations.



Colin McDonald AM (Brighton)

Colin joined Brighton in season 1963-64 following an illustrious Test career where he represented Australia in 47 Tests, scoring 3,107 runs @ 39.32

In his first season he made three centuries and scored consistently during his five years with the club, winning three batting averages and scoring seven centuries in all. He finished with a career total of 2,140 runs at an average of 35.08 from 59 games.

Colin always had a lot of respect for Sub-District Cricket and regarded it as being of a high standard, both during his playing days and beyond. He was a frequent attendee at past player reunions at Brighton and would, when invited, regale those present with his thoughts on the game and stories from his time as a player for both Australia and Brighton.



He passed away in January after a long illness at the age of 92.

Laurie Simpson (Sunshine)

The Simpson Family has had a long and very influential connection with the Sunshine Cricket Club, where Laurie was Club Treasurer from 1958 - 1990, then assumed the role as President from 1991 - 2006.

In 1996 he was elected as VSDCA Treasurer, a position he held for 8 years until he stepped down in 2004. Laurie also served on the VSDCA Investigation Committee from 1984 to 1993 and was also Sunshine's Delegate to the VSDCA for 26 seasons (1978-2004).

Laurie's contribution to cricket has been a significant one, at both Club and Association level.

The Association extends sincere condolences to the families of club members who have passed away in the past 12 months.
