COACH'S REPORT

Learn and Improve

With my first season at the helm of Langwarrin Cricket Club there was plenty for me to learn particularly with such a large number of senior teams and the names of the players was just the start of it! We had a solid and relatively normal pre-season with attendance at the indoor nets during August building up so that in September it was quite difficult to fit everyone in for some decent practice but more a dusting off of the cobwebs. The fitness sessions were not necessarily catered to have as many numbers there, but we still fell short of the player attendance I thought we could. Our ability to have some decent practice matches was thwarted by poor weather which was pretty much the norm from September to November outdoors. While in the traditional sense we could consider ourselves underdone we must remember that the opposition clubs were suffering from the same fate so there was no advantages or disadvantages going into the season. Now the season has been run and won (sadly by other clubs mostly!) here is my summary -

- Three of the seven men's teams qualified to play in the finals. 1st XI, 3rd XI & 7th XI all qualified.
- The Women's XI were Premiers – a fantastic result.

- There were an additional 11 centuries scored across the whole club for the season led by Matt Ashton (7th XI GF – 101 vs Tyabb, R5 – 158 vs Baden Powell, R2 – 121* vs Long Island, R8 – 115 vs Somerville), Adam Richmond (5th XI R9 – 131 vs Crib Point, R11 – 100* vs Delacombe Park), Ben Wells (R8 – 133 vs Somerville, 101* vs Tyabb), Simon McEvoy (2nd XI R8 – 104 vs Pines), Jason Burgess (3rd XI R11 – 122 vs Delacombe Park) and Paul Morrow (4th XI R8 – 101* vs Tyabb).
- Five wicket hauls were also achieved by Jake O'Brien (7th XI GF 5/39 vs Tyabb, R11 – 5/21 vs Long Island, R8 – 5/48 vs Somerville), Kurt Eigenraam (3rd XI R6 – 8/41 vs Ballam Park, R7 – 7/59 vs Mt Eliza) Mal Coutts (2nd XI R13 – 5/31 vs Sorrento), Kyle Rees (2nd XI R9 – 5/106 vs Red Hill), Mitch Trewin (3rd XI R5 – 5/100 vs Skye), Daniel Bray (3rd XI R11 – 5/38 vs Delacombe Park), Damien Moresco (5th XI R6 – 7/37 vs Baxter) Dan Oliver (5th XI R5 – 5/13 vs Crib Point), Matt Ashton (7th XI SF – 6/53 vs Baden Powell) and Dylan Wells (7th XI R6 – 5/25 Vs Frankston YCW)

There are quite a few people to thank as well on top of those player achievements to acknowledge.

To Gary Rees and the committee. It was a challenging year with several projects on the go and timings of renovations up in the air which no doubt was frustrating. We also had a horrible start to the year with the weather conditions affecting 4 of the first 6 Saturdays which made it difficult to get into some sort of routine and generate the type of social activity that is critical to a sporting club. You devoted your time generously and it's widely appreciated.

The captains of the teams including Chris Brittain (1st XI), Mal Coutts (2nd XI), Luke Smith (3rd XI), Travis Whelan (4th XI), Dan Holden (5th XI), Ryan Dixon (6th XI) and Ben Wells (7th XI) plus the 2 x Chairman of Selectors, in Ian Tim Harper & Dan Holden, did great jobs and handled quite a few disruptions in availability issues at the selection table with the return to the more traditional season. The captaincy role was also a little more than simply tossing the coin as our captains took great pride in their work which also included building a positive team environment, communicating to players, organising afternoon teas at home games and generally trying to give each player a chance to perform their best for the team and help the team achieve it's best results.

Congratulations to Kylie Walters and the Women's team on achieving 'Back to Back' premierships. Clearly there are a few outstanding players in the team but what was equally impressive was the team's ability to attract and welcome new players into the team when numbers got low and the broad landscape of the type of player that played from the very young to, let's just say, a more mature age player with limited experience. Also, Kylie was awarded the Women's Player of the Year.

A significant individual performance by Matt Prosser must be acknowledged. He won the Wedgwood Medal (Provincial 1st XI League Best and Fairest) for the third successive year. Matt was very consistent and prolific with the ball this year and added some handy runs which allowed him to be prominent in the umpire's adjudication of the best player. Well done Matt!

We welcomed (back) Ian, Amy and Leo Cockbain from the UK. Ian put forward some exhilarating match-winning performances in the main season as well as the T20s but more importantly was a regular at the club after training and games and always willing to offer any advice especially to those who were switched on enough to go up and ask him what he thought.

Thanks to Mal Reid and Rick Nolde who were our resident groundsmen. Shocking weather and then a saturation of senior and junior matches across three ovals meant we constantly needed the lines remarked on the pitches, the One Day and T20 restrictive circles - visible for umpires with ailing vision plus the various different boundaries sizes for the different grades and ages playing across the ovals.

Finally, to all the players who welcomed me into the club and followed my instruction then I trust you found improvement into your game. Sometimes cricket is a 'slow burn' so keep following the advice you were given or picked up on and I can guarantee it will benefit you in the long run.

Moving forward I am pleased to say that I will be back at the helm for season 2023/24, wiser for what and who I know, and am equally determined to give ourselves a chance to add more success to the history of Langwarrin CC. There will be some subtle changes to how things are done but by no means will I be reinventing the wheel so more focus will be around commitment and focus, technical improvements, and game day successes so that we can enjoy the club and have fun with everyone who is involved.

JUNIOR CO-ORDINATORS REPORT 22/23

Season 2022/2023 Junior Annual Report

This season saw a reduction in participant registrations at LCC which complimented a similar reduction league wide. Numbers were slow to register but we ended up with 12 sides submitted into the MPCA junior competition from U10's to U16's with 3 teams in each age bracket.

Unfortunately, again we did not have enough interest or numbers to field a girls only side, we endeavour to establish this inaugural side in the 23/24 season. Due to lower participation numbers in our U12's space and after many, many difficult conversations we were regrettably forced to fold our U12 West side and disburse players across to the two other U12's teams and a couple of young girls down to U10's. Although far from an ideal start in this age group almost all players went on to have great seasons in their newly allocated sides.

With seemingly correct league nominations we found almost all sides competitive in their allocated divisions with all but 2 competitive teams in U12-U16's playing finals and one of those 2 sides finishing the season in 5th place. Overall, a great indication of good competitive cricket, with the highlight being our U16 Premier and Central sides as well as our U12 Central sides all competing in grand finals. Unfortunately both U16's sides were unsuccessful in very close games but the highlight of the season was our very dominant U12 Central team lead by Ryan Johnson were clear winners bringing home the Premiership Cup. Congratulations again to Ryan and his U12 Central team.

As with previous years, mid-week junior cricket was alive and strong at Lloyd Park with many teams either training or playing. Friday nights saw the greatest participation with all 3 grounds hosting games at either U10 or U16 level. On occasions, as we have previous years, we were required to host Friday night home games at both EMC and Skye. Many thanks to both organisations for allowing us the use of their facilities.

Season 22/23 saw the reappointment of numerous junior coaches including Aaron Kelly, Ben Darcy, Chris Brittain, Ryan Johnson, Aaron Baleisis, Luke Smith, Ben Woodburne, Steve Byrne, Brad McNeilage, James Dornan and Matt O'Brien. Newly appointed coaches included Paul Muddiman, Nathan Withers and Mitch Bartlett, Mitch going on to receive the Jan Kersey Trophy for Best Junior club person. A huge thanks to all our junior coaches for their continued support, the time spent mentoring and coaching can often be long and demanding at times, but we genuinely appreciate all your time and effort this season.

We continued with the appointment of junior age level coordinators again this season after their successful introduction the season prior. Many thanks to James Dornan, Warren Abbey, Ryan Johnson and Brad McNeilage for your additional time in your respective roles. On the back of the success of the junior age level coordinators, it has been widely discussed at Executive and club committee level that season 23/24 will see a HUGE change in our junior structure. The introduction of our first junior subcommittee will be implemented to assist the juniors. A strong focus on player and coach development, more efficient streamlined communications and most importantly continuing to strengthen the bond between the juniors and senior are our priorities.
