Season 2018/19 Junior Annual Report

What another great season the Junior Club had this season. We started off strongly with great numbers where we had 153 players register in which we fielded 15 teams in all year levels from Under 10 to Under 16 and including another Girls team, which was one more team than last season. We had 5 out of 10 sides play finals, with all 5 of them finishing in the top 2. Our club was lucky to have 3 sides play off in the Grand Finals at home with our Under 14 Premier and Sub-Premier winning the Premiership with our Under 2 District side narrowly missing out and came Runners Up. Well done to all teams for making the finals and representing our club with pride. Also, a massive thank you must go Seaford Tigers CC that hosted 2 of our home semi-finals due to all 5 sides earning a home final.

Friday nights this year were massive at the club where on a couple of occasions all 4 teams (Under 16's & 3 Under 10's) were playing at home and it was great to see so many families down supporting their kids.

We again fielded a Girls team in the Girls Competition this season where they played on Tuesday nights with modified rules like the Under 10 boys competition. After Christmas they converted to the hard ball and played against more experienced teams. We had 8 girls play in this side, 2 returning players and 6 new players as the other girls were too old for the Competition. I had the pleasure of coaching these girls whose skill and ability improved throughout the season. TEAM REPORTS

SECONDS

Firstly, I would like to thank Gaz, Redda's and the committee for the opportunity to captain the 2nd X1 this year. I feel extremely privileged to have been given the opportunity to lead a side of this great club. Also, a massive congratulations to our 1st X1, going back to back is an amazing achievement and something I hope you will cherish for a lifetime. Don't be content with the 2, there is a great opportunity ahead of you to keep creating history. Stay hungry!!

Looking back to the start of pre-season where discussions and thoughts were had about what the makeup of this side would not only look like but what would also be deemed as reasonable season when comparing to some of the great 2nd X1 sides we have fielded in previous years, in my honest opinion, I expected a tough and challenging year ahead. HOW I WAS WRONG!!

My goals at the start of the season was for us to be competitive, play a positive and aggressive style of cricket with a huge emphasis on playing for one another but to also try help prepare some of the younger guys for what they could expect if given the opportunity to play 1st X1 cricket, not only in what to expect in a playing sense, but what to expect in the way they needed to train and prepare. I thought if we could achieve those goals, the season would be a success regardless of where we would finish on the ladder.

What I did not expect was the commitment and buy in from the playing group of what we wanted to achieve out of the season as a team, but also the want to go further than those goals and achieve more. We not only exceeded my expectations, but I also think the expectations of a number of people within the club along the way. That's a huge credit to not just the 10 players who finished off the year in the grand final side, but to every player that played in the team throughout the year.

Although we fell short at that last hurdle, there were several highlights and positive signs to take out of the season for the coming years.

- To see the way Josh Edwards grew throughout the year not only with his on-field performances but the temperament and leadership he showed was well beyond his years. He showed countless times throughout the season that his talent and ability was well above 2nd X1 cricket. The second of his 2 100's came in the semifinal where our backs were against the wall. Combined that with the pressure situation of it being a semifinal, for a 16-year-old, was one of the better moments I have seen in local cricket. That moment earn him a provincial 1st X1 premiership. I'm excited for what the future holds for him and I'm hopeful we can hang on to him for a few more years to come.
- I was proud to see Mitch "the self-proclaimed spiritual leader/vice-captain" Bromley take another positive step forward with his cricket playing nearly half of the season in the best cricket side on the peninsula. He really showed maturity and leadership at times through out the year and has a great way of bringing a team together.
- Andrew "Bowler #1" Smith's second half of the year was nothing short of brilliant. The way in which he bowled at times showed what a talent he is and proved that he is more than ready to take that next step next season. To see him back enjoying his cricket again is simply awesome. Combined that with the Improvement in Kai "shaker" Hiku not just from last season to this one but the improvement from week to week is a huge credit to the way he carries himself and the work he puts in. He is forever wanting to learn and better himself and the results showed throughout the season. You both created a great opening partnership.
- The surprise packet for me this year was the emergence of Mitch "Spirits" Trewin. The improvement in Mitch from the start of the season to the end of the season was extremely pleasing to see as a captain. There were several times throughout the year where he bowled at extremely tough times or in tight situations that probably early on may not have always gone his way, but to then see the way he grew in confidence and become confident to take on that responsibility really showed great character.
- The bowling duo: Damian "Trusty" Wust and Dan "The skipper" Oliver. As a captain having 1 bowler who you can rely upon to bowl dot balls consistently and build the pressure from one end is a great weapon to have.
