JUNIOR CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

Season 2021/22 Junior Annual Report

Our junior season began with some doubt on the back of a shortened junior football season but we did prevail. A full uninterrupted season saw us achieve all 9 rounds of cricket. Unfortunately our 12's and 14's all had to settle for one-day matches whilst our 16's played 3 2-day matches plus finals also being 2-day games. It was widely discussed amongst coaches that 2-day matches for ages 12-16 were deemed essential to assist with player development as well as providing greater opportunity for more equal player involvement. We hope to see these return during the 22/23 season.

After coming through a very difficult and disruptive Covid-19 period we still managed to field 13 junior teams. 3 x 16's, 3 x 14's, 4 x 12's and 3 x 10's. With 10 teams playing in competitive aged cricket, we had an amazing season with 6 teams making finals. U12's North and Central sides both lost in their semi-finals as too did the 16's Premier side. Our 14 Premier side were denied the opportunity to compete in their grand final with the Home teams ground being deemed "unplayable" due to extremely wet conditions.
