**Firstly, a big thanks for taking on the role as water person for this team today. Without the support of many volunteers, our teams would never make it onto the field each week, and believe us we are very grateful for your wonderful support.**

The role of water person is a very important one when it comes to the health and wellbeing of our players as dehydration even on the coldest days is a serious matter.

**Please take a couple of minutes to read through the points below and if you have questions or concerns about any of them please speak to your team manager:**

- Please wear the club supplied blue top that has the words Water Person clearly marked on it.
- Do not speak to any opposition players.
- Do not speak to any opposition officials.
- Position yourself on the boundary fence at least 20 meters from your coaches' box. A good area to stand is generally at the interchange gate.
- Ideally deliver water to the players during main breaks or when a goal is scored.
- Don't linger on the ground.
- You can enter and leave the field of play at any point on the boundary.
- No coaching of our players.
- Do not enter the 50 metre area when a team is kicking in.
- Do not enter the centre square area at a ball up.
- During the major breaks you are to offer water to the field umpire/s in the centre of the ground, but please do not engage in conversation with them.

**If you have any concerns or questions about an opposition player or official during the game please report it to your team manager. Please don't take the matter into your own hands.**
